- Previous and recent academic research on socioeconomic and ethnic inequalities in education
- Theories and evidence around self-fulfilling prophecies in the classroom
- The role of teacher-student relationships
- The impact of teacher expectations on students
- Potential biases in teachers' perceptions of students' academic abilities and attitudes

Participants are encouraged to critically discuss academic research and share their own experiences and views.

It is also an opportunity to develop and share strategies for their classrooms and schools to tackle inequalities.
